Grade Level/Dep t.	November 16 News and Updates to be shared with PTA
Kindergar ten	We are working hard on mastering our letters (Uppercase and Lowercase) and sounds! We are also spending time learning how to be thankful for what we have. We are almost up to 50 days of school and that means we are closer and closer to celebrating Day 100!!! We are enjoying working together and sharing and caring for each other.
1st Grade	We enjoyed shopping at the Scholastic book fair. It was exciting to see so many great books going home with kids. Our class reviewed Birch Lake Expectations and has been earning several Bear Paws for excellent behavior in the cafeteria, hallway and media center. Please remember to wear a warm coat, hat and mittens to school. Once it snows outside students will also need to wear boots and snow pants. This is a great time to practice zipping coats and tying shoes at home. Thank you!
4th and 5th Grade	4/5th graders have been working hard on drafting and revising our narrative stories. They are coming along great! We are excited to start writing our stories in actual books and publish them in our media center to share with the school.
Specialist s	PE-All 1st-5th Grade students have completed their fitness tests. We are currently learning about what each component of fitness the test does and why we do fitness testing. Each Elementary White Bear Lake student participates in fitness testing in the fall and spring. We used the students' scores from the fall and worked to improve them through a variety of activities and skills in the winter and take the same tests in the spring. We work on goal setting and discuss how to set realistic goals and how to achieve them. Make ups were attempted if a student missed a test. Kindergarten students are currently participating in a lot of kicking activities. They are learning how to properly kick a ball, trap a ball, and using the inside and outside part of your feet. K-2 students are currently participating in some parachute activities while 3-5 students are developing their volleyball skills
